

### Tour Program Summary

Mongolia is one of the last truly wild places on earth. Over twice the size of Texas this land locked nation is the least densely populated country on earth offering limitless pure air, clear skies, fresh water rivers and rolling grasslands. Starting in 1206 AD, a tiny group of hardy Mongolians lead by Chinggis Khan conquered and maintained the largest land empire the world has ever seen. Today remnants of Mongolian culture can be seen stretching from Korea to Hungary. The clean environment is home to multitudes of wildlife such as antelope, horses, gazelles and Bactrian camels. Traditional nomadic families still follow the seasons and herds subsisting on animal husbandry. The Mongolians are a proud and friendly people happy to share their unique lifestyle of bygone eras with visitors.

Your Mongolia adventure starts in **Ulaanbaatar**, which translates to Red Hero in Mongolian. This city sitting at an elevation of 4,500 ft/1300 m is the coldest average temperature capital city on earth but enjoys pleasant weather during the tourist season from April through October. Half of Mongolia's population lives in and around UB, and here you can tour functional Buddhist monasteries, excellent dinosaur fossils and the center of modern Mongolian government. Several fine hotels and restaurants can make your stay in the capital both comfortable and enjoyable.

**Hustai National Park** is surrounded by mountains, thick forests and lush meadows. It is home to the Przewalski endangered wild horse "Takhi" along with 60 other species of mammals and a vast range of plants. Hustai is also an excellent place for bird watching, horse riding, hiking and experiencing nomadic culture.

Next fly south to the **Gobi Desert,** the northernmost desert on earth. This unique ecological zone is home to diverse wildlife and amazing sand dunes and rock forms. Behold the Yol valley and Flaming Cliffs, incredible geological rock formations. Ride camels on some of the world's largest sand dunes at Khongor and look for dinosaur fossils in one of the world's richest deposits. Enjoy some of the most spectacular sunsets and brightest nighttime stars of your life in the isolated and other worldly locale that is the Gobi.

Finish your tour in hinterlands of Ulaan Baatar in **Terelj National Park** which offers hiking, swimming, climbing and wild life watching opportunities. On the way, back to Ulaan Bataar, visit the 140-foot-tall chrome **Statue of Chinggis Khan**, the unifier of Mongols and conqueror of the known world.

# Tour Daily Itinerary

Sep 04 Fri

→ Depart

Fly from North America to Ulaanbaatar.

Sep 05 Sat

→ Ulaanbaatar

Arrive in Ulaanbaatar today, met by your private Englishspeaking driver, transfer to one of Ulaanbaatar's finest hotels, the 5-star Best Western Premiere Hotel (deluxe rooms) for check-in. The evening is free for relaxation and exploration. Dinner is on your own.

Sep 06 Sun

Ulaanbaatar

Breakfast at the hotel; met by your guide and driver, take a city tour of Ulaanbaatar. Visit the Gandan Monastery, the National Museum of Mongolia, and the Main Square of Ulaanbaatar. Next, have lunch at a local restaurant. Then take a 1hr drive to visit Hustai National Park. Go to the information center before going to look for wild horses and other wildlife with a biologist. Have dinner at a Hustai camp before heading back to your hotel in Ulaanbaatar. The evening is at your leisure. <B-L-D>

Sep 07 Mon

Ulaanbaatar → Dalanzadgad Gobi

Early start today with a boxed breakfast; met by your guide, transfer to the airport for flight TBD (6:50am -8:10am) to Dalanzadgad in the Gobi Desert. Met by your local guide and driver, visit the Yoliin Am Gorge (1-hour drive), a beautiful narrow canyon with interesting geological rock formations. Enjoy a Picnic Lunch. The surrounding mountains are home to many rare wildlife species, such as Argali wild sheep, Ibex, and different types of birds. In the afternoon, transfer to the Khongor Sand Dunes and stay at the Gobi Erdene Ger Camp (en-suite log house with bath). Admire the brilliant Gobi sunset and enjoy a locally sourced dinner. <B-L-D>

Sep 08 Tue

Gobi Desert

Breakfast in the camp; visit the beautiful Khongor Sand Dunes and oasis. Enjoy walking and climbing up the sand dunes, some of the world's largest. Enjoy lunch in a local restaurant. This afternoon, visit a local nomadic family, learn about their culture, and how to cook Mongolian cuisine. Later, enjoy a Sunset Camel Ride through the sand dunes. This evening at the camp, enjoy a special dinner of local food cooked in the traditional manner on hot rocks over an open fire. <B-L-D>

Sep 09 Wed

Gobi Desert

Breakfast in the camp; take a 3-hour drive to visit Bayanzag: The Flaming Cliffs, one of the most famous dinosaur sites in the world. Hike in the multicolored cliffs or dig for dinosaur remains. Then watch an amazing sunset over the red landscape. Watch a ger assembly demonstration to see how they are built when nomads are traveling around the region. In the evening transfer to Dream Gobi Camp (en-suite ger with bathroom). Enjoy dinner at the camp and the evening is free at your leisure. <B-L-D>



Sep 10 Dalanzadgad Thu → Ulaanbaatar

Tereli

Breakfast at the camp; transfer the airport for flight TBD (8:30am – 9:50am), to fly back to Ulaanbataar. Met by your familiar UB guide and driver, head east to visit the Giant Chinggis Khan Statue, an impressive 135-foot-tall chrome edifice in the Sacred Tuul River Valley. Enjoy lunch in a local restaurant. Afterwards drive another hour <u>Tereli</u> National Park. Check into the Dream Terelj Lodge (en-suite ger with bathroom). After dinner admire the brilliant stars of the clear night sky. <B-L-D>

Sep 11 Fri

Terelj National Park Breakfast at the camp; enjoy a half day visit to the 13th century theme park. Enjoy a picnic lunch. Then go hiking to <u>Turtle Rock</u> and the <u>Temple of Meditation</u>. The scenery there is fantastic and there are great opportunities for hiking, bird watching, rock climbing, swimming and rafting. In the afternoon, enjoy a two-hour horseback ride across the steppes on the same horses ridden by Chinggis Khan's armies as they conquered the known world eight centuries ago. Return to camp for another dinner and sunset. <B-L-D>

Sep 12 Sat ⇔ Ulaanbaatar

**Terelj National Park** Breakfast at the camp; drive back to Ulaanbaatar and tour the city. See the Gandan Monastery, where monks chant in this functioning Buddhist monastery built over a century ago. Tour <u>Sukbaatar Square</u> and <u>Mongolian</u> Parliament. Go to the National Museum housing, one of the world's best dinosaur fossil collections and expansive Mongolian anthropology exhibits. Have a Mongolian cuisine lunch. In the afternoon, visit Bodg Khan's Palace Museum and go to the top of Zaisan Memorial Hill for a panoramic view of the city. Afterwards, enjoy a Mongolian folklore concert and have a farewell dinner of traditional Ulaanbaatar cuisine. Stay overnight at the Best Western Premier Hotel (deluxe rooms). <B-L-D>

Ulaanbaatar Sep 13 Sun → Return

Breakfast at the hotel; transfer to the airport for your own booked flight home or on to your next destination. <B>
